1. Describe Your Business:

I specialize in providing personalized wine and brewery tour transportation, with a focus on trips originating in the Watkins Glen area and visiting locations on Seneca Lake. While that is my focus and my "wheelhouse," I am flexible and can accommodate just about any request for transportation in the Finger Lakes for up to 7 people. I'm starting off as a lady with a van and a dream.
